


## Child searching is a very important part of the adoption process.

Family Adoption Specialists conduct at least 8 \*child searches each month for our Matching Assistance Members. Many families don't have time to sift through the 1000's of children seen on these listing sites. Your Family Adoption Specialist does this for you. Searching and reading each child's biography for the right fit for your family. The information is compiled into a search document that gets sent to you each time your Family Adoption Specialist searches.

With every child search we conduct, families receive information such as state of residence, child's age, or D.O.B., case/id #, web URL, and a biography of information available to the public.

Some of this information is needed to submit your homestudy.

Your Family Adoption Specialist or our submission team will attempt to collect caseworker contact information whenever possible.

## TO SUBMIT YOUR HOMESTUDY ON CHILDREN FOUND

If you see a child on another website or your Family Adoption Specialist sends you a child search, and you want to submit your homestudy on one or more of the children, you can do so by logging in to your Matching Assistance Account. Clicking on the "Submit On Offsite Child" button on your Family Home Page brings you to the next step.

Fill in the information circled below and click Option B submit. Answer the questions on the next screen and submit again.

Questions are:

- Why are you a good match for this child/children?
- Is there anything in your study you would like to further explain?
- Have you done additional training and/or supports since the study was written?

**That's it!** Your submission request has been sent to our submission team and will be processed within 48 hours.

## The Role of the Family Adoption Specialist

(included with the \$100 membership)

As a part of one of our Matching Assistance Programs, each family receives contact from a Family Adoption Specialist. They are specially trained to find children who meet the family's child preferences. Their first priority is to provide families with eight child searches per month, four from our Matching Assistance database, and another composed from over 70 active photolisting sites across the country.

Family Adoption Specialists are also available to help answer questions about the adoption process including submission, selection, and placement. They keep in contact with your Adoption worker to stay updated about your progress in your adoption journey. Additionally, these motivated individuals can help find contact information and complete follow up on children a family has submitted their homestudy for.

The adoption journey can be a long and difficult. Your FAS is a great source of support during the process. These caring individuals are there to help you with technical issues, questions, resources, or if you just need to tell someone how you are feeling.
