	<p>Agency updated training requirement for all families to include de-escalation training. Families adopting children CANS level 2+ will be required to become CPI certified (up to, not including holds).</p> <p>“Train the trainer” CPI training has been taken by two AFFEC employees. And we are prepared to certify families who are at risk of using restrictive interventions.</p> <p>Agency has updated procedure regarding oversight of full disclosure documentation.</p> <p>Agency has implemented incident report outlining steps that need to be taken for reporting should a hold occur.</p> <p>Finally, it was determined that the family and the agency cannot support the placement of this child in the family’s home as the child requires intensive residential treatment to maintain stabilization. The adoption disrupted and the child has been placed in residential care in Arizona. The family has maintained regular contact with him.</p>
